Responsibility in the details – impact on the system

How our connection technology can support modern timber construction

Timber construction can help to store carbon throughout a building's lifespan and reduce the use of high-emission building materials. SIHGA® supports this development with innovative and certified fastening solutions for façade, decking, concrete and timber construction projects.

SIHGA® Monitorix® digital monitoring system for timber and mineral construction enables the early detection of moisture ingress. This allows damage to be identified at the very outset and appropriate measures to be taken before larger sections of the structure are affected. This can reduce the cost of refurbishment, extend the service life of structures and support the responsible use of materials and buildings. Our systems are designed for durability, ease of dismantling and reusability, thereby supporting a circular approach to construction.

Around 80 per cent of our product range is manufactured in Austria and Germany. Our collaboration with regional partners helps to minimise transport distances.

Another key focus is on innovative system solutions such as:

- 1 **GoFix® MS II** – Timber construction screws with an EPD and a planned screw recall
- 2 **Modulix®** – Dismantlable connection solutions
- 3 **Monitorix®** – Digital moisture monitoring for timber and mineral construction

Transparency about what we do

What we measure, reduce and improve

For SIHGA®, sustainability is not just about our approach, but also about transparency regarding our measures and key performance indicators.

In the 2024 financial year, the total carbon footprint amounted to 4,483 tCO₂e. The vast majority of this is attributable to **Scope 3 emissions** from purchased materials such as steel, stainless steel, aluminium and plastics. The carbon footprint was calculated in accordance with the guidelines of the Greenhouse Gas Protocol.

Our measures to reduce:

- Expansion of the photovoltaic system at the Ohlsdorf site
- Conversion of the vehicle fleet to electric vehicles
- Use of renewable energy sources
- Resource-efficient packaging solutions
- Collaboration with suppliers to develop Product Carbon Footprints (PCFs)

In addition, we are continuously investing in measures to improve the energy efficiency of our processes, as well as in digital solutions.

A key aspect of our business model is supporting modern timber construction methods. As a result, our systems can help to reduce the use of CO₂-intensive building materials in suitable applications.

Scope 1: Direct emissions from the company's own sources (e.g. company vehicles, heating systems).

Scope 2: Indirect emissions from the generation of purchased energy (e.g. electricity, district heating).

Scope 3: All other indirect emissions from the value chain (e.g. purchased materials, waste disposal, product use).
